Maths

Today I would like your child to practise working out addition questions using objects and number lines. This will help with counting one to one, counting accurately as well as number formation and numbers to 20. There will also be word problems which will need reading for your child. They need to understand words like 'more', 'total' and 'altogether' mean you need to add the 2 amounts. Use 'Addition questions sheet' for your child to complete. Please encourage your child to read the number sentence including the symbols to build the mathematical vocabulary. Once finished, email it.

Letters and Sounds - no photo/image required to send back

Letters and Sounds are now live lessons every morning on Teams for everyone. Please ensure your child attends this session as it is very important for them to continue to learn how to read and write. Your child will need phoneme frames drawn on paper or in a book. It looks like this. They will need at least 6 of these drawn separately.

English

Today we are going to practise forming capitals letter and using them in sentences. Use 'Capital letters' pdf to go through the learning. Then use the relevant sheet for your child to complete. Once finished, email it. You do not need to send a picture of the capital letter formation.

RE

Recap the Easter story by reading it again.

Use 'Easter story emotions' to go through the activity.

Then use the sheet provided for your child to cut and stick the pictures correctly and let them draw the emotion face underneath each picture.

Alternatively, your child can draw the pictures on separate paper and draw the emotions underneath. Once finished email it.
