Maths

Today your child will be learning how to read numbers 11 - 20 through different representations (pictures). Use the 'Representing numbers' pdf to go through the learning and discuss/answer questions. Maths

To consolidate numbers 11-20, here are some fun activities to do at home;

- Go outside and count objects to show numbers 11-20, e.g. counting 13 pebbles, collecting 11 sticks, etc.
- Say a number between 11-20 for your child to write down and practise with other numbers.
- Practise writing numbers in order from 0 to 20.
- Practise verbally counting forwards and backwards from 0 to 20.
- Choose a number from 0 to 20 and practise verbally counting forwards and backwards from that number.
- Use BusyThings to reinforce learning numbers 11 to 20.

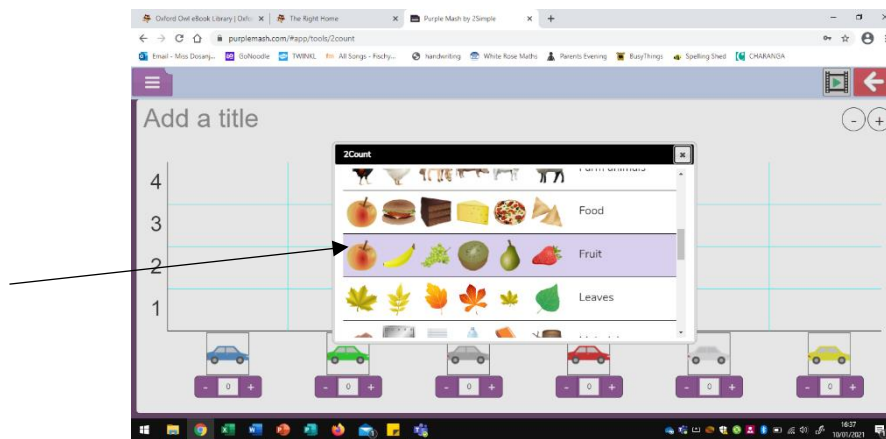
You do not need to email work for this, but it is important to complete regularly to move onto the next set of lessons.

ICT

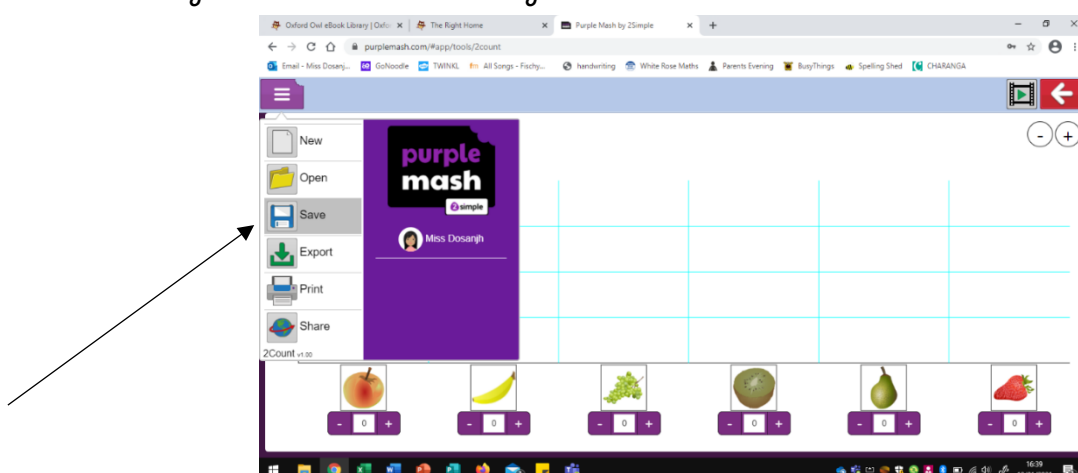
This week for ICT, I would like your child to begin making a pictogram. This is a graph which uses pictures and you put in numbers for each picture (really easy and fun!) This will also help with numbers to 20!

Log in to PurpleMash (for those who are new to home learning, please email me if you need your child's login information).

Click on 2Do at the top and open up the pictogram programme. Your child will need to scroll to select fruit from the options.



Then give them the information to put in for each type of fruit. When they click on the plus, it will add fruit, and if they have added too many they can use the minus and it will take fruit away. They will need to keep an eye on the left side where the numbers will show every time they add fruit so they will need to count carefully! Please save the work as 'fruit pictogram' where I can mark it and give feedback which you can read to your child!



Here are the numbers for how many children in another class like fruit.
