Once upon a time

You can write about who the girl was, where she was and what she was doing. Look at my sentences.



Once upon a time there was a girl called Goldilocks. She had hair.

This is fine but we can make it better by adding adjectives (describing words) and using the word and to stretch out our sentences to make them a little longer.

Once upon a time there was a girl called Goldilocks and she had long blonde hair.

She was walking. She saw a cottage.

She was walking in a forest and she saw a cosy cottage.

Now I have added better description, adjectives and the word and it sounds much more interesting to read!



Now you have a go at your sentence. It can start with

Once upon a time

You can write about who the girl was, where she was and what she was doing. Some of you should be able to write 1 simple sentence but the rest of you should be able to write 2 or 3 sentences.

Remember don't copy mine! You all have brilliant ideas when we do writing. Think of your sentence, tell your adult, then write it using your sounds. Then think of your next sentence, tell your adult, then write it.

We need to write a sentence or some sentences for picture number 2.

You can write about what she did, what she liked and how it tasted.

Look at my sentences.



She went inside. She saw porridge. She ate it.

She *crept* inside *and* saw *steaming* porridge. She *tried them all*.
Goldilocks liked the last porridge because it was so sweet!

I have changed my sentence starters so I am not repeating she. I have also written that she tried all the bowls of porridge otherwise if we write about each one we will write too much!

I wonder what your sentences are going to be? How did she go into the cottage? What did she do? What was the porridge like? Which one did she like and why?
