Things I need to know

- Use geographical vocabulary to refer to human and physical features

Vocabulary

City – a large town with lots of different types of houses, transport and buildings.

Cliff – rocks on the side of the land usually found at the edge of a sea.

Coastline – the land along a coast.

Factory – where things are made by machines.

Harbour – a place by the coast where ships can stay safe and get shelter from rough weather or other large ships.

Mountain – where the land has risen making a very high and steep hill.

Office – a building where there are rooms where people do their work.

Port – a place where ships can load or unload objects.

Town – larger than a village but smaller than a city and usually has a shopping area and lots of other buildings.

Valley – where two hills meet at the bottom making a v shape sometimes with a river running through at the bottom.

Vegetation – growing plants.

Village – a small group of houses and buildings normally in the countryside.
