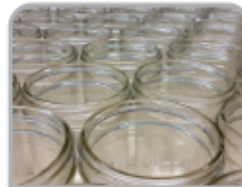

Vocabulary

- Dull** – doesn't look bright or shiny
- Hard** – can't be bent easily or broken
- Material** – what an object is made from
- Object** – a thing that can be used. For example, chair, car and table are all objects
- Rigid** – can't be bent
- Rough** – feels and looks uneven or bumpy
- Shiny** – light comes off this easily
- Smooth** – when the surface of an object is even
- Soft** – easy to cut, fold or change the shape of it
- Stretchy** – can be pulled to make it longer without it breaking
- Squashy** – easily crushed or squeezed
- Transparent** – can be seen through
- Waterproof** – keeps water out
