

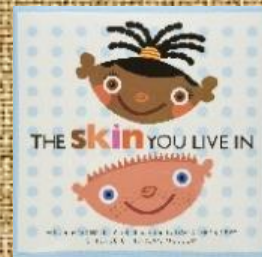
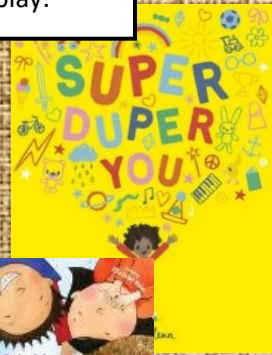
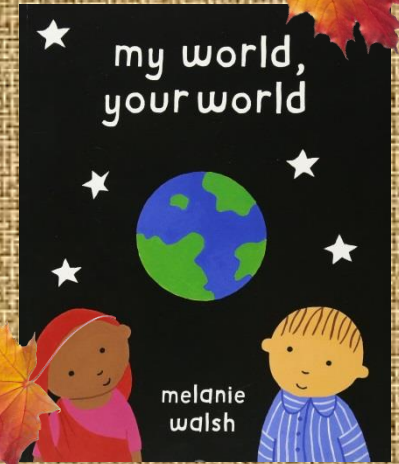
# Reception Curriculum Information. My World, Your World – Autumn 1 – September 2023

Our topic in the Autumn term 1 will loosely be based upon 'My World, Your World!' and 'All About Me!'. We are excited to see where our learning leads us this term, whilst getting to know our new Reception cohort.

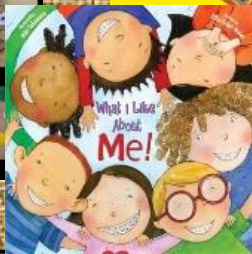
Through this topic the children will explore and celebrate their likes and dislikes and celebrate their differences. Using mirrors they will discuss how we are similar but also different, making them unique. We will celebrate that all children and people are different and our differences are what make us special. Children will produce self portraits using paint colours and loose parts play.



We will read the story 'We are Family'. Children will celebrate how each family is unique and have the opportunity to talk about their family and people who are special to them. Linking the story to the theme 'My World, Your World' Children will share what they like to do with their families and can bring a photograph from home to develop a 'family display' for the children to ask their friends questions and display in our home corner.



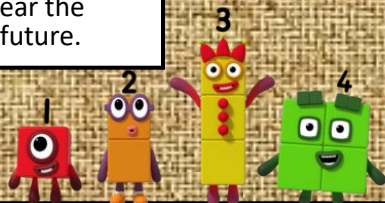
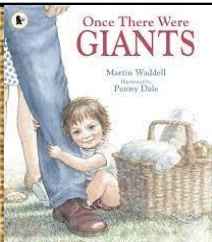
Children will learn the names of the different parts of their bodies and discover some of the different things that our bodies can do. They will explore and discover their senses and how these tell our bodies about the things that we are seeing, hearing, smelling, touching and tasting.



There will be lots of opportunities to write and make marks, whilst writing about themselves, their families and where they live – making their mark on the world. Children will begin to write their names using cursive script and use their name cards to help them.



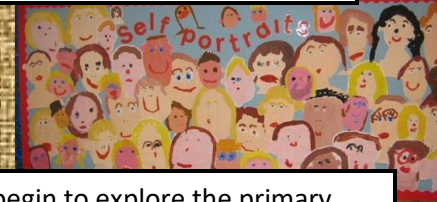
Through the book 'Once There Were Giants' the children will explore how the human body grows and changes that take place. We will begin to hear the vocabulary past, present and future.



During number time we will begin to explore the numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4. We will begin to subitise and compare numbers to each other.

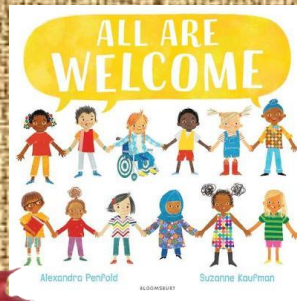


Children will begin to explore the primary colours and how these can be mixed together to create other colours. We will explore different mediums creates lots of self portraits, looking in detail at our facial features.



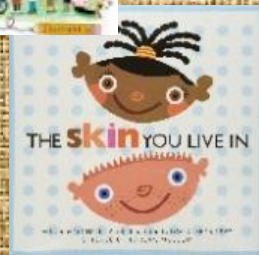
### Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

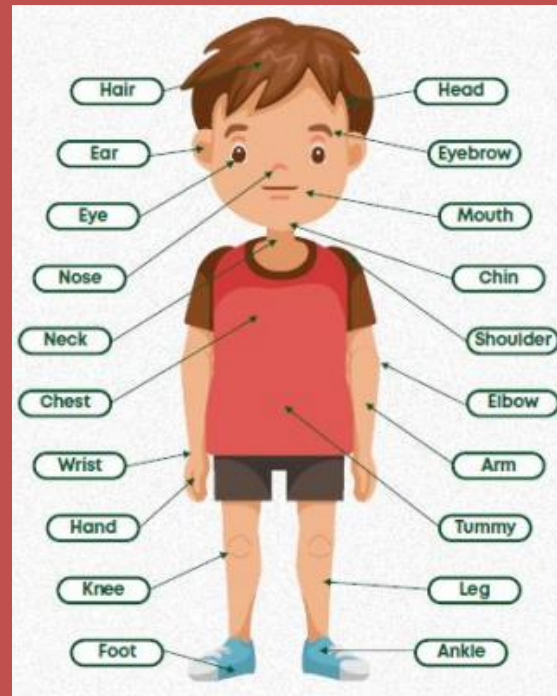
