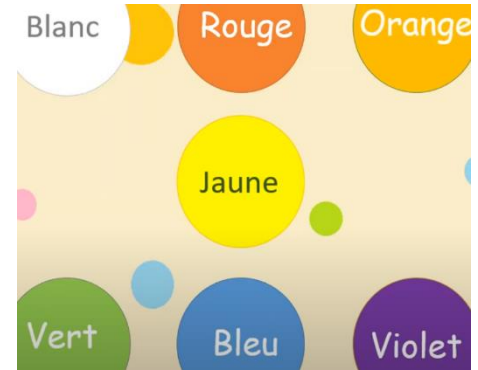
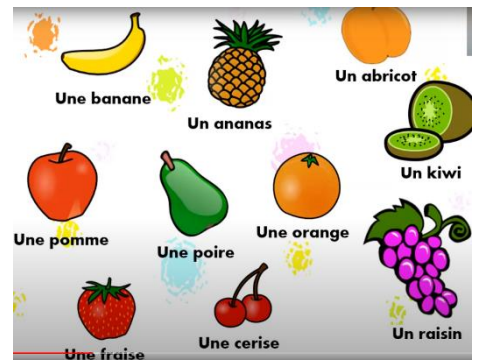

## Who was Responsible for the death of Jesus?



**Judas Iscariot** - One of the twelve closest followers of Jesus. Judas helped the guards to find Jesus so they could arrest him. Before meeting Jesus, he was part of a group who were fighting to overthrow the Roman Army. Did Judas want to force his 'Messiah' into taking action against the Romans? Soon after the betrayal Judas killed himself. Did he intend the betrayal or was he tricked by the Pharisees? Did he do it for the thirty pieces of silver he was paid? If so, why not live to use the money?



**The Pharisees (Sanhedrin)** - They were the religious authorities in Jerusalem. They were angry with Jesus for chasing the money lenders out of the temple. It showed he had no respect for their authority. They did not believe Jesus was the Messiah - the Son of God. They were insulted that he claimed he could forgive sins because they believed only God had that kind of power. They arrested Jesus for crimes against God. They did not have the power to execute criminals because the area was under Roman control so they tried to persuade the Romans to give Jesus the death penalty.



**Jesus** - The Bible says that Jesus already knew he would be betrayed, arrested and killed in Jerusalem. Yet he turned over stalls and chased people out of the temple - acting as if he owned the place! He told people their sins were forgiven. He preached in the temple and declared himself to be the Messiah. He told the Roman Governor that he was the king of the Jews - an act of treason against the Roman Empire. Did Jesus have a death wish? Did his actions leave the authorities with no other choice but to execute him?



**Pontius Pilate** - The Roman Governor did everything he could think of to avoid sentencing Jesus to death. He said no to the Pharisees. He then gave the crowd the choice - certain that they would want a violent murderer executed rather than a peaceful religious teacher. Should Pilate have been more decisive? Ultimately the decision was his to make.



**The People of Jerusalem** - The crowd were presented with two prisoners - Jesus, and a murderer named Barabbas. They were asked to decide who would go free and who would be crucified. They chose death for Jesus. Were the crowd swayed by the powerful and influential Pharisees? Did they really understand what they were doing?



**Satan** - Some say it was the devil himself who put hatred and fear into the hearts of the Pharisees. They say it was Satan who tempted Judas into his act of betrayal and who whipped up the crowd into a blood-thirsty mob. Was Satan responsible for the death of Jesus? Or is it too easy to make excuses for human acts of evil by blaming them on an evil being? Does Satan even exist?



**The Roman Soldiers** - They arrested Jesus - when he healed the ear Peter chopped off, they could have decided Jesus must be innocent. They beat him. At the cross they hammered the nails into his hands and feet. They could have let him go. They could have told the officer in charge they weren't going to do it because it was just wrong.



**God** - Jesus prayed and asked God the Father if he could avoid death. However, Jesus decided that it was what God the Father wanted so Jesus the son went ahead with God the father's plan.
